What If I Get Scammed?

If you believe to have been the victim of a scam, call Valley County dispatch immediately at 406-228-4333 option 2. Reporting to law enforcement will help you when you reach out to your bank or to try to stop pay-

ment on any type of cards that you have purchased for the scammers. When you call dispatch make sure to ask for the number attached to the report (aka CFS number) this will be the number to give the bank or Apple cards etc. and will help law enforcement in the area track the types of scams that are going around and the M.O.'s the scammers are using. After calling dispatch, call the 1-800 number on whatever card they asked you to purchase (Apple card etc.) and let them know you were scammed. Give them the CFS number provided by dispatch. Then notify your bank you were the victim of a scam. The bank may need track account to ensure there are no fraudulent charges or cancel your cards. Lastly you may need to monitor your identity depending on the information that was given to the scammer to ensure that your identity is not stolen. They are several very good identity tracking sites to use you can go to identitytheft.gov for more information. For more information or question call the Glasgow Police Department at 406-228-8050.



2023 FLC Foundation Scholarship awardees on Scholarship Sunday.

The First Lutheran Church Foundation is perpetual fund that was established in 1979. Only the interest earned on the fund is expended. The earnings from the Foundation are intended for special needs and programs, not the ordinary administration and maintenance of the church. The interest may be used scholarships, special donations, and capital improvement projects. In 2023, the First Lutheran Church Foundation awarded 6 scholarships. The scholarships can be awarded to college students who are entering their second, third, or fourth year of an undergraduate or technical school program. FLC Foundation donations for 2023 include, the FLC Lift Project, Troop 861 Boy Scouts, Flathead Lutheran Bible Camp, Lutheran Disaster Response, Operation Bootstrap Africa, and ELCA Ministries.



FLC Council Highlights June 19, 2023

- Council members present: Shelly George, Beverly Johnson, Marvin Johnson, Max Knodel and Tara Wesen. Absent: Mandy Rasmusan, Donna Lee, Judi Martin and Darcie Waarvik. Others present: Leanne Fontaine, alternate Greg Forrester and Pastor Scott.
- Devotions: We discussed chapter 4 from the book Reclaiming the "L" Word. Every Christian is a minister. Everyone is welcome at church—don't draw a line. Don't exclude others.
- Youth and family: The position for youth director is being advertised. The executive team will meet to discuss the job description and other options on how to advertise the position.
- Preschool report: Will pay the church \$500 per year for supplies. Tech committee: Still working on live streaming the services on Facebook. The audio is clear, but no music comes through. Bev will
- Treasurer's report: Total income for May was \$15,634.05. Total expenses were \$17,833.59. May's cash flow was -\$2,199.54. YTD cash flow is -\$8,442.73.

look into possibly getting the screen in the sanctuary fixed.

- Special project report: We now have a total of \$191,518.76.
- Synod convention report: Pastor Scott attended. The theme was Equipping for Generosity. They discussed how we are called to live generous lives. We should see the gifts God has given us and respond accordingly.
- Three people were interviewed for the custodial job. Debora Mac-Donald was hired for the position. The noisy offering for July will go to the snack program at Irle School and Youth Dynam-
- Tara Wesen will serve as a member of the council in Lacey Flaten's place. She will be on the Discipleship Team.

TEAM REPORTS:

- Property: They are discussing cleaning up the front of the church. They hope to tear out all the old vegetation and replace it with gravel and ornamental grasses. They are working on getting bids for a deck for the parsonage. Dick Markle hung a beautiful diamond willow cross that he made on the front of the church.
- Discipleship: They will find out if there are people in need of rides to and from church and if there are people willing to give rides to church. FLC offers free rides to Nemont and Prairie Ridge residents to and from Sunday church services at First Lutheran Church. It falls under Evangelism in the Discipleship budget. Sandy would like to put up posters at Nemont, Prairie Ridge and FLC to help get that running again. Tana Tweten will be the contact person for this.
- Stewardship: There will be a combined worship service on June 25 in Kiwanis Park in Fort Peck. Lutheran pastors from the surrounding churches will help with the service. After the service there will be a lunch. A lot of work has gone into the planning of this
- Financial: \$100,000 from the special project will be put in a CD at Edward Jones for 9 months with approximately 5.3% interest. A CD worth \$31,081.74 is maturing on July 22. The CD will be renewed at ELCA Mission Plus for one more year at 5.1% interest.
- Pastor Scott's report: It has been an extremely busy month. Pastor has had 6 funerals and one burial. He has had hospital visits, planning of funerals, meeting with families, cluster meetings, interviews for the custodial position, attended the Synod assembly in Great Falls, visited Prairie Ridge and Valley View, worked with the stewardship team on the planning of the church service in Kiwanis Park, home visits and more.

Pastor Scott is taking time off between July 3 and 13. Max will be doing the service. The week of July 23, Pastor Scott will be attending Flathead Bible Camp to serve as one of the pastors there.
