Message from Pastor Scott

Happy New Year! I pray that the New Year finds you well and that you look forward to 2022 as a time for new possibilities. The New Year is about new beginnings – Starting over or starting something new. This is what we have been doing together for the last seven months, starting something new. Starting a new way of doing ministry at First Lutheran Church.

Our readings for the New Year seem to reflect this idea of new beginnings. Jesus' baptism is one of the first stories from the bible that we get in the New Year. With Jesus' baptism we also remember our own baptisms where we are made new in Christ. Baptism is about a new beginning. But it is not a onetime thing, we remember our baptisms new each day. We remember that we are sealed by the Holy Spirit and marked with the cross of Christ forever. That is what a life in Christ is all about being made new each day. Every time your sins are forgiven you are made new – you experience a new beginning. This happens each Sunday with Confession and Forgiveness when you hear the declaration that your sins are forgiven. This happens in the Lord's Supper where you receive forgiveness of sins, life and salvation. And of course, this happens in baptism where the old self is put to death and a new creation arises out of the water. In response to the question "What does Baptism mean for daily living?" Martin Luther writes in the Small Catechism. "It means that our sinful self, with all its evil deeds and desires, should be drowned through daily repentance; and that day after day a new self should arise to live with God in righteousness and purity forever."

Knowing this might not fix all that is going on in your life, it might not end the trials and temptations that we all are faced with. What it does is give us something to cling to, knowing that we belong to God and that God is with us now. When Martin Luther would wrestle with moments of despair and depression, he would claim his baptism. He would remember that he was a baptized child of God and no matter what happens in this world nothing could change this. Live into this New Year knowing that you are a new creation in Christ and that you are God's own.

Motions passed

- The September 12, 2021 and October 18, 2021 minutes as well as the November financial report were approved.
- Council approved the closed session motion concerning staff wages.
- Motion to renew a CD at 0.05% was approved.
- \$111.14 from the Friends of Reynolds program will be given to FLC Preschool for scholarships.

Reports

Youth & Family: Served brunch 11/14, Stew feed 11/21, CSI caroling and meal 12/15, Preschool Christmas Program 12/18, Bibles for 3rd graders and new youth planned for December, commitment to attend the Minneapolis Gathering before Christmas

Preschool: The classes are almost full and there are needs for scholarships. The cookie dough sales went well.

Education: The CSI Christmas party will be December 15, 2021.

Discipleship: The team’s budget was approved. The October Noisy Offering went to purchase from Good Gifts the Honey Bees and materials for vegetables gardens.

The team is working on the 2022 schedule for Service Group Leaders.

Finance: The 2022 visionary budget was presented.

Property: The projects architects were here for a meeting in October and a contract has been presented for their work.

Worship: Christmas Eve service will be at 5:00pm. It will be a youth and family service with candlelight, choir, and singing.

Executive: Expenses of \$163.63 for a pastor candidate to visit were approved for payment. There is now a file drawer in the church office for team usage.

Pastor Scott: There was one burial. The first Lutheran Education course is completed and the second one has begun. Confirmation is going well. The Bishop’s Convocation was online this year. Pastor Scott attended the Glasgow Ministerial meeting. Bellringers for the Salvation Army will be needed for December.


Noisy Offering
