School will be starting again in August; sports practices begin in August also. In September Confirmation, and CSI will begin. Hopefully by then we will have a new Youth Director hired.



tion, being empty nesters, living alone, retirement whatever the new beginning in your life know that Jesus is walking with you as you go forward.







Toward a Theology of Church Picnics

Excerpt from June 6, 1983, article by John Piper, Founder & Teacher, desiringGod.org.

may as well close up shop. Either all we do has to do with God or he is not God. "Whether you eat or drink, or whatever God" (1 Corinthians 10:31). "Whatever you do, in word or deed (like picnics), do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus, almost won the three-legged couples' giving thanks to God the Father through him" (Colossians 3:17). So part of my duty as pastor-teacher is to help you see how even church picnics relate to God. This is no ivory tower theology. No, sir. On Sunday, June 12, after the second service we are going to Ham Lake Camp for the annual Sunday School picnic. The evening service will not happen at church. There will be a 4:00 p.m. vespers at the camp. So this theology is very rele-

- 1. Meeting as a church out-of-doors is an affirmation and celebration of God as creator of the world. "In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth" (Genesis 1:1). By divine appointment "The heavens are telling the glory of God; and the firmament proclaims his handiwork" (Psalm 19:1). It is fitting that the people of God gather corporately beneath the heavens to hear the proclamation of the firmament. Surely, the sky should join us in worship once a year. The admiration we feel for the Maker of the world is doubled when we exult in it together.
- 2. Informal togetherness, especially involving recreation, cultivates the unity of God's people, which we are commanded to maintain (Ephesians 4:3). It does this in three ways.

There is unpressured time for natural, extended conversation—and significant relationships take time.

We are thrown together with people we don't otherwise talk to. And some of the

We feel a new kinship with people when we see them dressed differently and inyou do (like picnics), do all to the glory of volved in recreation. For example, some people probably think the pastor is a real dud. But did you know that Noël and I race last year? And I wasn't wearing a suit! It was like the time I first learned in college that my philosophy teacher cut his own grass—with jeans and a T-shirt!! We are commanded, "Love one another with brotherly affection" (Romans 12:10). It is much easier to develop affection for a person if you see him tumble in the grass. And of course, this goes for all of you. Stodgy stereotypes need to be broken. Picnics are great for this. It makes for the "family-feel" ... and affec-

- 3. A leisurely afternoon together affirms the need for rest and re-creation. "Come away by yourselves to a lonely place and rest a while," Jesus said to the weary twelve (Mark 6:31). We are not God. And he invented the Sabbath to remind us of that. It is theologically appropriate that now and then lawn chairs replace church pews.
- 4. "Well done, good and faithful servant; you have been faithful over a little, I will set you over much" (Matthew 25:21). The little that the Sunday School has to put on a picnic it uses well. We will ride buses not a hundred cars.

So bring your duds (or wear them to church) and let's spend the afternoon with each other and with God under the greatest vaulted dome ever made. Eager to be with you, Pastor John"

FLC Council Highlights May 15, 2023

Council members present:

Shelly George, Beverly Johnson, Marvin Johnson, Donna Lee, Judi Martin, Mandy Rasmusan, and Darcie Waarvik. Absent: Max Knodel. Others present: Leanne Fontaine and Pastor Scott. Lacey Flaten has resigned from the council. Tara Wesson has agreed to take over for Lacey.

- Devotions: We discussed chapter 3 from the book Reclaiming the "L" Word. We discussed the statement "Jesus is Lord so I can't be." We talked about things in our life that could easily become "gods".
- Youth and family: 11 students were confirmed. 130 people were in church. VBS has been cancelled. The \$407 from the soup suppers will be used for camp scholarships.
- Tech committee: Jennifer is taking care of the slides. Kurt and Audra Breigenzer purchased a new camera and equipment for the live streaming of the services.
- Treasurer's report: Total income for April was \$18,241.97. Total expenses were \$18,079.67. April's cash flow was \$162.30. YTD cash flow is -\$6,243.19. Mattfeldt Electric \$266.29 installed a motion detector light at the bottom of the stairs.
- Special project report: There is a piggy bank for the special project. The steering committee meets weekly. June 5. There will be a house plant sale at Donna's house (831 6th St. N). The proceeds will go to the special project. The lift has \$100,789.28, bathroom \$15,289.81 and unspecified \$801.34. There is a total of \$116,880.43. Money from Friends of Reynolds for the first guarter totaled 253.54. These funds will be put in the unspecified special project fund. The noisy offering brought in \$194.20 for the special project.
- We moved to give \$250 to the Montana Synod

offering.

TEAM REPORTS:

- Property: The estimate for the repair of the windows was double what the architects estimated. The property team suggested looking for other estimates for the window project and postponing this project until more information is obtained.
- Discipleship: There will be a noisy offering in July.
- Stewardship: There will be a combined worship service on June 25 in Kiwanis Park in Fort Peck. They are meeting next Monday to discuss more details.
- Education/Youth: 11 seniors will be recognized on May 28. They will have a breakfast which is being prepared by Darcie and Mandy.
- Pastor Scott's report: Had 2 baptisms— Tripp and Luxe Mavity. 2 funerals. Paul Aune's funeral will be June 16 at 11:00. Met with each of the confirmation students and practiced for the confirmation on May 14. Visited Prairie Ridge and Valley View each week. Had communion both at various homes and at the hospital. Went to a lot of meetings. Senior recognition and Pentecost will be May 28.
