

Strawberry Pizza

1 cup melted butter

Crust:

Filling:

2 cups flour

1 tsp. Vanilla 12 oz. Cool Whip

Garnish:

1 cup finely chopped pecans

8 oz. cream cheese, softened 1 cup powdered sugar

3 pints strawberries, hulled and washed 1/2 cup strawberry jelly, melted over low heat

For crust, combine ingredients and press into greased pizza pan. Bake at 350 degrees for 10 minutes or until lightly browned.

For filling, beat cream cheese, sugar, and vanilla together until fluffy - about two minutes. Fold whipped topping and spread over cooled crust. To garnish, place each strawberry cut side down on top of filling to cover pizza. Brush strawberries with melted jelly.
