Bible Studies

The Divine Drama® is an intermediate level, adaptable Bible survey course presented in two parts: the Biblical Narrative and Our Narrative. Part 1 - The Biblical Narrative leads students through the entire book of Holy Scripture in 16 sessions. Part 2 - Our Narrative explores basic Christian teaching in 14 sessions.

With 136 full-color teaching graphics de-

signed to help people grasp and remember the key events and concepts of the Bible, the focus of this series is on the forgiving grace of God, who came to us in Jesus Christ to rescue us from sin and restore us to a right relationship with our Lord. This course is suitable for adults and youth.

Johnson, Max Knodel, Tara Wesen, Mandy Rasmusan, Donna Lee, and Judi Martin. Absent: Shelly George and Darcie Waarvik. Others present: Leanne Fontaine and Pastor Scott.

Devotions: We discussed chapter 5 from the book Reclaiming the "L" Word. The Gospel gives us hope and life. God always comes down to us. We are saved through our faith in God and not because of anything we have done to earn it.

- Youth and family: The position for a youth director is still available.
- Treasurer's report: Total income for June was \$9,236.18. Total expenses for June were \$14,329.76. June's cash flow was -\$5,093.58. YTD cash flow is -\$13,536.31.
- Special project report: We now have a total of \$212,718.76. They are con-

sidering buying the lift now before there is a price increase.

- Half of the offering from the outdoor worship in Fort Peck was given to Lutheran Disaster Relief and half to Lutheran World Hunger.
- Pastor Scott's report: 5 funerals, hospital visits, planning of funerals, meeting with families, visited Prairie Ridge and Valley View two times each, Endowment meetings. Pastor Scott will be gone to Flathead Bible Camp July 23-28.
